

HOW WE GOT HERE

Founded in 1950, the Brewers first played their games at Wellington Street before moving to Eton Park in 1958. The club's rise through the Conference and into the Football League coincided with the move from previous ground Eton Park to our current home, the Pirelli Stadium, built just a stone's throw from their former home on the site of the Italian tyre giant's Sports and Social Club.

Although the ground opened for business in July 2005 with a low key pre-season friendly against Chester City, the Pirelli Stadium was officially opened in November 2005 by Manchester United who ironically returned to the Pirelli two months later in the FA Cup third round with Albion holding the Premiership giants to a 0-0 draw in front of a then record ground attendance of 6,191 before losing in a replay at Old Trafford. The stadium has now witnessed football for the Brewers in the National League, League Two, League One and in the Championship.

This guide has been designed to answer any questions you may have before your visit to the Pirelli Stadium and includes every detail you will need, such as how to get to the ground, where to park, and what facilities are available for supporters.



FROM A38 (DERBY) AND M1 NORTH (JUNCTION 28)


Exit the A38 at the first turning for Burton (North). Take this exit (A5121) and proceed along Derby Road, passing McDonald's on your right and the Petrol Station on your left until you reach a roundabout. Turn right at the roundabout onto Princess Way and the entrance to the ground is 300 yards on your right.

FROM A38 SOUTH (LICHFIELD, BIRMINGHAM)

Take the second exit for Burton (North). Take this exit (A5121) and proceed along Derby Road, passing McDonald's on your right and the Petrol Station on your left until you reach a roundabout. Turn right at the roundabout onto Princess Way and the entrance to the ground is 300 yards on your right.

PARKING

Car parking is available at the Pirelli Stadium. Overflow car parking is located at the nearby Rykneld Trading Estate (First exit at the roundabout before turning right into Princess Way). The Pirelli Stadium is located opposite the old Eton Park Ground





GETTING HERE & DIRECTIONS (CONTINUED)

CAR/MOTORCYCLE & PARKING

The Pirelli Stadium is located just off the A38. Exit the A38 at the Clay Mills junction and follow Derby Road (A5121) until you reach the second island. Take a right turn at the island and then right again into the car park. In order to be more environmentally friendly, Burton Albion recommends car sharing where possible.

Car or motorbike parking is available at the Pirelli Stadium for 400 vehicles at a cost of £5 per vehicle. Supporters can also park in the Ryknild Industrial Estate for £5. Access to the site is from the Derby Road Island by taking the first exit and this is signposted on match days. Please Note: parking cannot be pre-booked and is based on a first come, first served basis. Cash is collected on the day by the stewards on the main gate.

CYCLING

Burton Albion encourages fans to walk or cycle to the Pirelli Stadium if possible. There are cycle paths along Princess Way leading to the Stadium. The Pirelli Stadium also has bicycle racks available on site outside of the West Stand.

WALKING

The Stadium is an approx 15 minutes walk from the train station and a short walk from bus stops around the ground. Fans can easily walk to the Pirelli Stadium from Stretton and other residential areas.


TRAIN

Burton Railway Station is around a mile and a half away from the Pirelli Stadium. As you come out of the station turn left and go down the hill. Turn right into Derby Street and from there it is a straight road up to the stadium. It should take about 25 minutes to walk.


BY BUS

The journey time between Burton Town Centre and Pirelli Stadium is around 6 minutes and covers a distance of around 2 miles. Operated by Trent Barton, the Burton upon Trent to Pirelli Stadium service departs from Burton upon Trent, Railway Station and arrives at the Pirelli Stadium, departing every 30 minutes.



ENTERING THE GROUND

The Pirelli Stadium provides both seating and a standing terrace for home supporters.

On entering the stadium, a search will be conducted as part of the Burton Albion Safety process. We kindly ask supporters not to bring any items that might slow down the search regime, including rucksacks and large bags. Once inside the ground you will be directed by our stewards to either your seat or the standing terrace, dependant on which ticket you have purchased.

If situated in the terrace you may be politely asked to move along to assist in maintaining gangway and entry point space for everybody's safety. We ask that all fans co-operate with instructions from the stewards which are for the safety and welfare of all supporters.

Under-3s are allowed in the seating area only at no extra charge, but must remain on their parents laps. All supporters over the age of 3 will be required to purchase a matchday ticket. Under-5s are not permitted to watch the game from the terraces for their own safety, but can purchase a ticket in the seating areas.

We are unable to offer refunds to anyone who misses all or part of the game and advise fans to arrive inside the stadium as early as possible (at least 30 minutes prior to kick-off). Turnstiles open 1 hour and 30 minutes before the game starts, with bar and refreshment facilities available and pre-match entertainment.











DISABLED SUPPORTERS

Burton Albion is committed to ensuring that all disabled supporters have an enjoyable experience at the Pirelli Stadium.

WHEELCHAIR USERS

The club has a number of wheelchair bays available for supporters. The disabled wheelchair bays for home fans are situated in front of the North, West and South Stands.

Wheelchair users and ambulant supporters who are in receipt of medium to higher disability allowance or enhanced PIP are entitled to have a carer accompany them to the Pirelli Stadium free of charge. Tickets for disabled supporters can be purchased by contacting the club ticket office. Proof of entitlement will be required when booking tickets. The club advises ambulant disabled supporters to purchase their match ticket in the seated stand on Row A where there are no steps required.

Disabled supporters who require additional assistance or access when entering the stadium can do so through the side gate, located next to the turnstiles for each stand. They will be greeted by one of our stewards who will arrange to admit them with their match ticket.

ACCESSIBLE TOILETS

There are accessible toilets and facilities located in all the stands for disabled supporters. These are clearly signposted but should you require assistance, please seek out advice from the nearest steward. Standard radar keys can be used to access the toilets.

ASSISTANCE DOGS

Any supporter wishing to attend the Pirelli Stadium with an assistance dog needs to contact our Supporter Liaison Officer prior to the fixture to make arrangements.

CAR PARKING

There are a number of disabled car parking spaces available at the Pirelli Stadium. Supporters can book these in advance by calling 01283 565938 at a cost of just £5, payable on booking.

Booking disabled parking guarantees a space on the main car park, however there could still be a walk involved to get from the car park space to the relevant turnstiles. If a wheelchair space is required you can inform the club at the time of booking so we can ensure this is allocated, otherwise a normal space on the car park will be issued.

CATERING FACILITIES

All of our catering and bar facilities have a low level counter, adequate for wheelchair users. As a club we are dedicated to making your trip to the Pirelli Stadium an enjoyable experience.





FAMILY SECTIONS

Block 7 of the Carling Stand (South Seating) and Section J of the Raygar Stand (North Terrace), are Burton Albion's designated 'Family Areas'.

Supporters should enter the ground via turnstiles D, E and F for the Carling Stand (South Seating), and via turnstiles K,L,M and N for the Raygar Stand (North Terrace).

Following this, please make your way towards the designated area in your stand. A match day Steward will be on hand to assist fans if they require any help or assistance.

No person will be allowed into the Raygar Stand Family Area unless they are attending the match with an under 16. There will be zero tolerance of bad language in all areas of the stadium.

Honesty Flags will be on offer to junior supporters in these areas, which we kindly request are returned to Burton Albion Community Trust Staff/Volunteers on exiting these areas.

Baby Changing facilities are available in each stand inside the accessible toilets. These are clearly signposted but should you require assistance, please seek out advice from the nearest steward. Standard radar keys can be used to access the toilets.

Billy and Bettie Brewer will also be on hand in these areas, prior to and throughout the game, as they help to cheer on the Brewers!









We love to welcome families to the Pirelli Stadium and the fun starts as soon as you arrive at the ground.

Head over to the 3G pitch at the Community Football Centre for all our Pre-Match Family Zone! Billy and Bettie Brewer will be waiting to greet you and you can enjoy a kickabout with our two club mascots.

There will be fun and games and music to get you ready for the big game and we encourage you to grab an honesty flag to wave in the ground (and return afterwards please).

The family activities start 90 minutes before kick off at each home game and Brewers first team players make regular appearances. Check out our social media on the day of the game to see who is coming and at what time.







FOOD & DRINK

Refreshments are available in the supporters' concourses at the Pirelli Stadium. There are bar and refreshment facilities within these areas, which offer a range of pies, burgers, hot dogs and chips and peas. Confectionery and both alcoholic and soft drinks are also available. All of our food is cooked and served fresh, so there may be queues at peak times - but it's worth the wait!

Payments via card are encouraged inside the Pirelli Stadium. However, the nearest cash machine is located at the Co-op Food Store almost opposite to the car park entrance.

All of our bars also show live Sky Sports Football and are open from 1.30pm.

FURTHER INFORMATION

FOUL AND ABUSIVE LANGUAGE:

Any supporter who persistently uses expletives could face ejection or a ban from the stadium. Any supporter that becomes victim of any abuse can report it through the 'Kick It Out' app. The app can be downloaded on iPhone and Android devices.

KICK IT OUT - REPORT IT:

If you've seen discrimination in football - online or at a grassroots, non-league or professional game - don't turn away. Report it to us so we can get the right people involved and support everyone affected.

SMOKING POLICY:

In accordance with our ground regulations*, smoking is not permitted in the stadium and the Pirelli Stadium is a smoke-free stadium. This includes any type of e-cigarette or vapours.

NON-PERMITTED ITEMS WITHIN THE STADIUM:

Bottles or cans, cameras, digital cameras, video equipment, vuvuzelas, large bags, pushchairs, flares and pyrotechnics.

Fans are reminded that is illegal to bring pyrotechnics such as flares and fireworks into the Pirelli Stadium. Burton Albion, alongside the Premier League, EFL, National League and the FA, have worked with the FSA on the 'Love Football, Protect the Game' campaign to introduce new measures and stronger sanctions to tackle anti-social and criminal behaviours, such as entering the pitch and the use of pyrotechnics.

SAFEGUARDING:

Burton Albion Football Club operates a child or adult at risk centred approach to safeguarding and where concerns about the welfare of a child/adult at risk exist, staff will always act in the best interest of the child/adult at risk.


